

WHAT IS LEADERSHIP?





Leadership involves

Social influence: ensuring that the work of others contributes toward achieving a defined goal.

Taking risks: and challenging the status quo to achieve specific outcomes.

Setting and accomplishing a goal: the ability to think about a future you wish to see and contribute to.

NEGOTIATION



Negotiation is an important skill to possess as a young climate leader.

There are numerous situations where you may need to exercise your negotiation skills.

Example 1: When speaking to your local government representative about adaptation solutions you want to see implemented.

Example 2: When speaking to a local non-governmental organisation about funding for a project that engages youth in your community on climate change.



TO NEGOTIATE EFFECTIVELY, FOLLOW THESE







ELEVATOR PITCH






- A short speech (2-5 mins) that tells people exactly who you are, what you do, and why it's important.
- It communicates what solutions you offer, or what you aim to achieve with a product or campaign.
- You use it to quickly capture someone's
 attention and secure their interest for a
 further, deeper discussion.



ELEVATOR PITCH FOR A CLIMATE CHANGE PROJECT



Your elevator pitch should give your audience:



- A concise, basic description of your climate change adaptation solution, campaign, or business proposition.
- An indication of the need, or growing demand, for what you are proposing.
- An understanding of the value your solution, campaign, or business brings to the community at large.
- A **positive impression of you and your team**, and an indication of your expertise (i.e. why you are the best people for the activity).



ELEVATOR PITCH: KEY SUCCESS FACTORS



Know who you are talking to before you start.

Practice, practice, practice.


If people ask recurring questions, this shows your pitch is missing something. Revise it.

Have a 1–2-minute version ready for networking events and impromptumeetings.

Have a five-minute version ready for longer pitch events.

After your pitch, exchange contacts and follow up with an executive summary about your adaptation solution, campaign, or business.








CLIMATE POLICIES AT NATIONAL LEVEL

How can young people engage in climate adaptation policy processes?

Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs)



Read up on the Paris Agreement and familiarise yourself with NDCs.

Participate in NDC processes if these are established in your country. If these processes are not in place, advocate for creating mechanisms to involve young people in the process of formulating, implementing and updating NDCs.

Conduct **youth consultations on NDCs** to provide recommendations for improvements to decision makers and increase ambition.

Monitor the results of the different parts of the NDC process.

This will help you identify challenges in the process that you may help to improve.



STAY INFORMED AND SHARE WHAT YOU KNOW





- Monitor your country's climate reports.
- Read your country's adaptation communication. You can find all submitted National Communications at the UNFCCC website.
- Share information about climate change and adaptation actions on your social networks.
- Organise or join an awareness-raising campaign to encourage public understanding.
- Start a petition for a climate change adaptation policy issue.
- Train future generations on climate advocacy and climate adaptation issues.



What climate adaptation actions are already happening in your community?



Who else might be working on similar issues? Can you find allies and/or opportunities to partner with others?



Do you have the necessary technical and financial resources?



Do you or your team have the capacity?



How will your actions impact the community?





ITALY YOUTH4SDGS, POLICY BRIEF, 2023





Analysis & ideas

In 2023, only 15% of the SDGs were met and we were mid-point towards 2030.

Youth4SDGs was an initiative led by youth done in collaboration with three Italian associations.

It aimed at providing a youth perspective to foster the implementation of the SDGs at national level with actionable proposals.





CLIMATE DEBATE IN THE CONTEXT OF THE G7 IN ITALY, 2024





Intergenerational climate debate

It combined high-level speakers and interactive group discussions




CLIMATE DISASTERS WIPED OUT 1% OF THE BULGARIAN ECONOMY IN 2025

















Percentage of Europeans thinking that climate change is first or second most important issue








Do you want to engage in climate decision making but have no clue where to start? This workbook will guide you step by step to influence climate action.


The Youth Climate Pact Dialogue allows young people to engage in European decision-making by giving them an opportunity to co-create and participate in discussions with high-level officials from the European Commission.

Through it, a group of young Climate Pact Ambassadors can voice their opinions and needs, ask questions, and discuss policy recommendations. This personal exchange between young people and European Commission officials is livestreamed, allowing people across Europe to participate and ask questions virtually.

A Youth Dialogue offers young people the opportunity to discuss current issues with politicians in person and can be adapted to any political level – local, regional, national or European level – for example, by organizing it with a city mayor, a minister, or a Member of the European Parliament.
